## ● Troop Committee Meeting

The next meeting of the Troop Committee will be this Wednesday (April 17, 2002) at the Presbyterian Church. These begin promptly at 7:00 P.M. and are generally concluded by 8:30 P.M. Parents are invited, and encouraged, to attend these committee meetings.

## ● Dorchester International Brotherhood Camporee

The Permission Slip and Health Form for this activity has been included with this handout. It must be completed and returned, with your payment, by Monday, April 29, 2002.

As stated earlier, you will need to provide a raised seal copy of your Scout's Birth Certificate as well as a current valid passport or a Michigan Identification Card. This is a little more than we have required for past trips to Canada, but in light of the events of September 11, 2001 we want to assure a smooth and relatively quick crossing into, and especially, out of Canada at Customs.

## ● Troop Swim Night

The Troop Swim is this Friday, April 19, 2002, during the open swim, 7:00 to 9:00 P.M., at Fenton High School. The cost is \$3.00 per person.

For the new Scouts it would be an ideal opportunity to work on your Second Class swim skills as well as possibly completing your First Class swim skills requirements as well. The First Class swim skills requirements have been changed and those changes have been included in the Boy Scout Requirements 2002 Book. The requirements listed in your Boy Scout Handbook are most likely the "old" requirements.

## ● Meeting on Monday, April 29, 2002

We will have a regular Troop meeting on Monday, April 29, 2002. This night was originally set aside for the Troop swim but the Fenton pool is no longer available for rental on Monday nights.

## ● Tall Pine Council Hike-A-Thon

This is a fund raising activity by and for the Tall Pine Council. The Hike-A-Thon hikes will be held on Saturday, April 27, 2002 and will be held at the Davison Regional Park, Davison, Michigan. There will also be a Council Camporee held on this same weekend in conjunction with the Hike-A-Thon. The Camporee and associated activities will be held at the same location as the Hike-A-Thon with the activities starting at about the time the hikes are ending so that you may participate in both. Traditionally the first year Scouts have hiked the five mile hike so that they could return to the campsite to work on Tenderfoot and possibly Second Class Scout skills however, due to the Council Camporee, all Scouts may hike whichever distance they wish to (5 miles, 10 miles or 20 miles). You need to make that decision by Monday, April 22.

Prizes this year will be gift certificates (Scout Bucks) to the Tall Pine Council Scout Shop which may be used toward Uniforms, camp gear or camp fees or anything else available through the Council Scout Shop.

An equipment list and a Permission Slip and Health Form were included as part of Handout No. 19. The Medical Information and Permission Slip and Medical Form was to be completed and turned in Monday, April 15, 2002 along with your payment.

The Hike-A-Thon Sponsorship Form with whatever amount of money you were sponsored for must be turned in on Monday, April 22, 2002.
